They both have been very active in forming of St. Martin, 1979 paid for the flooring in the Nave and Sanctuary, 1973 started the building fund. Always there Mowing the lawn, Taking pictures to save our history, making beautiful flower arrangements with alter guild. In the early years they are always there both finically and bodily.

Raymond "Bo" and Bobby Foote, Founding persons of St. Martin. I have had it told If the Foots had not been with St. Martin, St. Martin would not be here. Very active with vestry, The youth, teaching Sunday school. Helped with raising money for our church. Sr. and Jr. Warden, Alter Guild, ECW, Secured loan for property in the 1970's. Memorial fund started in memory of Bobby's mother, had building bricked in 1979, did electrical work. Was treasurer of church. Their grandchild was the first Baptism at St. Martin.

Dan and _____ Gun, Came to St. Martin 1970-1971. Very active in building of St. Martin. On Vestry and Sr. and Jr. Warden. Convention delegate in the '90s. Licensed Lay Reader, Chalice Bearer, and LEM. Had Alter Railing installed, 1982 bought Carpet and had it installed in office and chapel. Worked on getting large sign Out front. They were always available to help financial and with their person.
