

Definition of Confirmed Communicant in Good Standing
From Article II.1 of the Parish Bylaws

(e) “Qualified Voters” are those Members of the Parish who are Confirmed Communicants in Good Standing and who are at least 16 years of age. Qualified Voters have seat, voice, and vote at the Annual Parish Meeting or any specially called meeting of the Parish.

(f) “Communicants in Good Standing” are all Members of the Parish who for the previous year have received Holy Communion in The Episcopal Church at least three times, have been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and have been faithful in working, praying and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God and are financial contributors to the Parish of record.

(g) “Confirmed Communicants in Good Standing” are those Communicants in Good Standing who have received the sacrament of confirmation as indicated in the Parish's records.

Summary:

Qualified Voters are Confirmed Communicants in Good Standing of the parish who are at least 16 years of age. Confirmed Communicants in Good Standing are members of the parish who have received the sacrament of confirmation as indicated in the parish records and who for the previous year have received Holy Communion in The Episcopal Church at least three times, have been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God, and are financial contributors to the parish.
