Almighty God, you know that we have no power in ourselves to help ourselves: Keep us both outwardly in our bodies and inwardly in our souls, that we may be defended from all adversities which may happen to the body, and from all evil thoughts which may assault and hurt the soul; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF EXODUS

Exodus 20:1-17

Then God spoke all these words:

I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; you shall have no other gods before me.

You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above, or that is on the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I the Lord your God am a jealous God, punishing children for the iniquity of parents, to the third and the fourth generation of those who reject me, but showing steadfast love to the thousandth generation of those who love me and keep my commandments.

You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the Lord your God, for the Lord will not acquit anyone who misuses his name.

Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. For six days you shall labour and do all your work. But the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God; you shall not do any work—you, your son or your daughter, your male or female slave, your livestock, or the alien resident in your towns. For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but rested the seventh day; therefore the Lord blessed the sabbath day and consecrated it.

A READING FROM PAUL'S FIRST LETTER TO THE CORINTHIANS

1 Corinthians 1:18-25

The message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written,

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart."

Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

THE HOLY GOSPEL John 2:13-22

Deacon The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

The Passover of the Jews was near, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple he found people selling cattle, sheep, and doves, and the money changers seated at their tables. Making a whip of cords, he drove all of them out of the temple, both the sheep and the cattle. He also poured out the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. He told those who were selling the doves, "Take these things out of here! Stop making my Father's house a marketplace!" His disciples remembered that it was written, "Zeal for your house will consume me." The Jews then said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews then said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and will you raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking of the temple of his body. After he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this; and they believed the scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken.

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

God of all mercy, we pray for the Church universal, that you would unite all people, bishops and clergy together in truth and love, and reveal your glory in the world through your church. Intercessor God of all mercy, give wisdom and insight to the people of our nation in selecting our leaders; let them be kind, but never compromising on the needs of all people; grant that they would respect the variety of beliefs represented in our country, as well as all people groups, acknowledging and valuing our shared humanity. Heal the wounds that divide us, and grant that we might take part in that healing, worthily loving our neighbors as ourselves. Hear us, O God.

People Lord, have mercy.

Intercessor God of all mercy, we pray for the welfare of the world, and all who call it home. We pray for all areas of the world that are in conflict: Ukraine, Gaza, Central and South America, and Africa. We pray for those affected by the world-wide drug crisis, and the global refugee crisis. We pray also for a heart of stewardship and care for our planet. Hear us, O God.

People Lord, have mercy.

Intercessor God of all mercy, we pray for unhoused neighbors and the volunteers who support them. We pray for an open dialogue for our educators and those who would benefit from their knowledge and instruction. We pray for openness with our church neighbors and love for all who worship you. We pray for those who are isolated and excluded and those who feel alone. In our community, we pray for the students, teachers, and staff of Grapevine Colleyville ISD, Green Valley Elementary, and Grisham Middle. Hear us, O God.

People Lord, have mercy

Intercessor God of all mercy, your son brought good news to the despairing and the suffering, freedom to the oppressed, and joy to downcast. Fill us with your spirit that the people of our day may see his likeness and glorify his name. Save us from the pride that would refuse your command to live like you in simplicity and joy, loving our neighbors as ourselves. To you we pray for all who suffer, including those we now name (PAUSE) Hear us, O God.
