A READING FROM THE BOOK OF NUMBERS

Numbers 21:4-9

From Mount Hor the Israelites set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; but the people became impatient on the way. The people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food." Then the Lord sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. The people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you; pray to the Lord to take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. And the Lord said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live." So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

A READING FROM PAUL'S LETTER TO THE EPHESIANS

Ephesians 2:1-10

You were dead through the trespasses and sins in which you once lived, following the course of this world, following the ruler of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work among those who are disobedient. All of us once lived among them in the passions of our flesh, following the desires of flesh and senses, and we were by nature children of wrath, like everyone else. But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved—and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the ages to come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God—not the result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life.

Jesus said, "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

"Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. Those who believe in him are not condemned; but those who do not believe are condemned already, because they have not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the judgment, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil. For all who do evil hate the light and do not come to the light, so that their deeds may not be exposed. But those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God."

THE NICENE CREED

Page 358, Book of Common Prayer

Celebrant and People

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead. and the life of the world to come. Amen.

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Intercessor Let us pray for our church and our world, saying, "Lord, have mercy."

God of all mercy, we pray for the Church universal, that you would unite all people, bishops and clergy together in truth and love, and reveal your glory in the world through your church. We pray for The Episcopal Church, St. Bartholomew in Hempstead, St. Cecilia's in Round Top, St. Francis of Assisi in Prairie View, and St. Francis' in College Station, and for Family Community Church, and Family Worship Centers Assembly of God. Hear us, O God.

People Lord, have mercy.

Intercessor God of all mercy, give wisdom and insight to the people of our nation in selecting our leaders; let them be kind, but never compromising on the needs of all people; grant that they would respect the variety of beliefs represented in our country, as well as all people groups, acknowledging and valuing our shared humanity. Heal the wounds that divide us, and grant that we might take part in that healing, worthily loving our neighbors as ourselves. Hear us, O God.

People Lord, have mercy.

Intercessor God of all mercy, we pray for the welfare of the world, and all who call it home. We pray for all areas of the world that are in conflict: Ukraine, Gaza, Central and South America, and Africa. We pray for those affected by the world-wide drug crisis, and the global refugee crisis. We pray also for a heart of stewardship and care for our planet. Hear us, O God.

People Lord, have mercy.

Intercessor God of all mercy, we pray for unhoused neighbors and the volunteers who support them. We pray for an open dialogue for our educators and those who would benefit from their knowledge and instruction. We pray for openness with our church neighbors and love for all who worship you. We pray for those who are isolated and excluded and those who feel alone. In our community, we pray for the students, teachers, and staff of Heritage Elementary, Hidden Lakes Elementary, and Hillsboro ISD. Hear us, O God.

People Lord, have mercy

Intercessor God of all mercy, your son brought good news to the despairing and the suffering, freedom to the oppressed, and joy to downcast. Fill us with your spirit that the people of our day may see his likeness and glorify his name. Save us from the pride that would refuse your command to live like you in simplicity and joy, loving our neighbors as ourselves. To you we pray for all who suffer, including those we now name (PAUSE). Hear us, O God.

People Lord, have mercy.

Intercessor God of all mercy, we pray for all who have died, [including N.]. Hear us, O God.

The Celebrant continues

All glory be to you, O Lord our God, for that you did create heaven and earth, and did make us in your own image; and, of your tender mercy, did give your own Son Jesus Christ to take our nature upon him, and to suffer death on the cross for our redemption. He made there a full and perfect sacrifice for the whole world; and did institute, and in his Holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, he took bread; and when he had given thanks to You, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

And now, O Lord and heavenly Father, we, your people, celebrate and make, with these your own holy gifts which we now offer back to you, the memorial your Son has commanded us to make; remembering his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again with power and great glory.

And we humbly ask you, O merciful Father, to hear us, and with your Word and Holy Spirit, to bless and sanctify these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be for us and to us, the Body and Blood of your dearly-beloved Son Jesus Christ.

And we earnestly desire your Fatherly goodness, in accepting this, our sacrifice of praise and thanks-giving, by which we offer and present to you, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies. Grant, we ask, that all who take part in this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with your grace and heavenly blessing; and also that we and all your whole Church may be made one body with him, that he may live in us, and we in him; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord.
