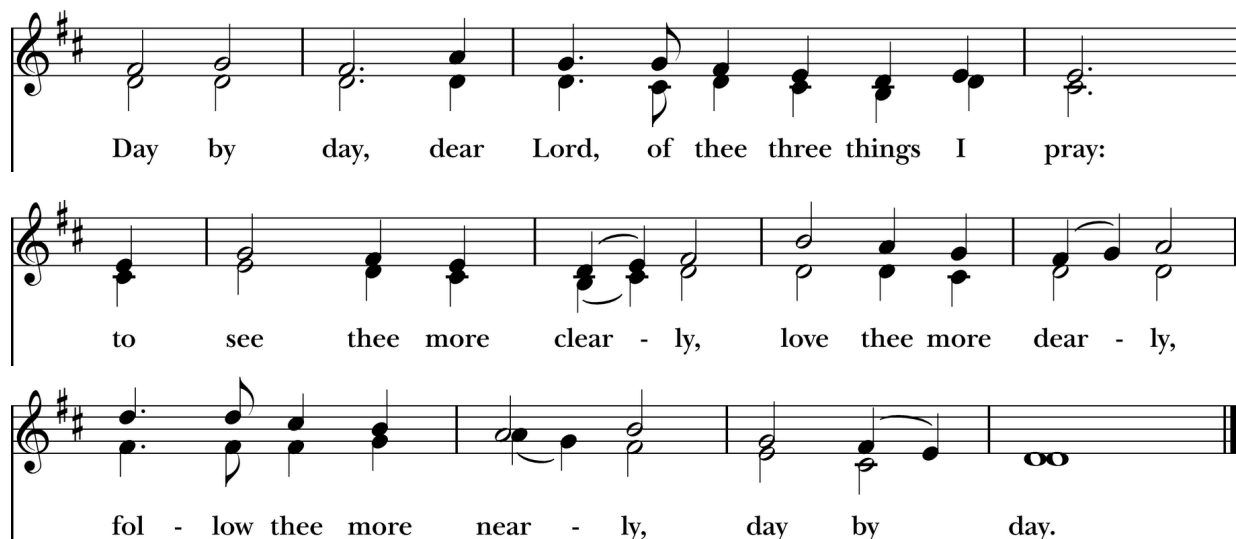

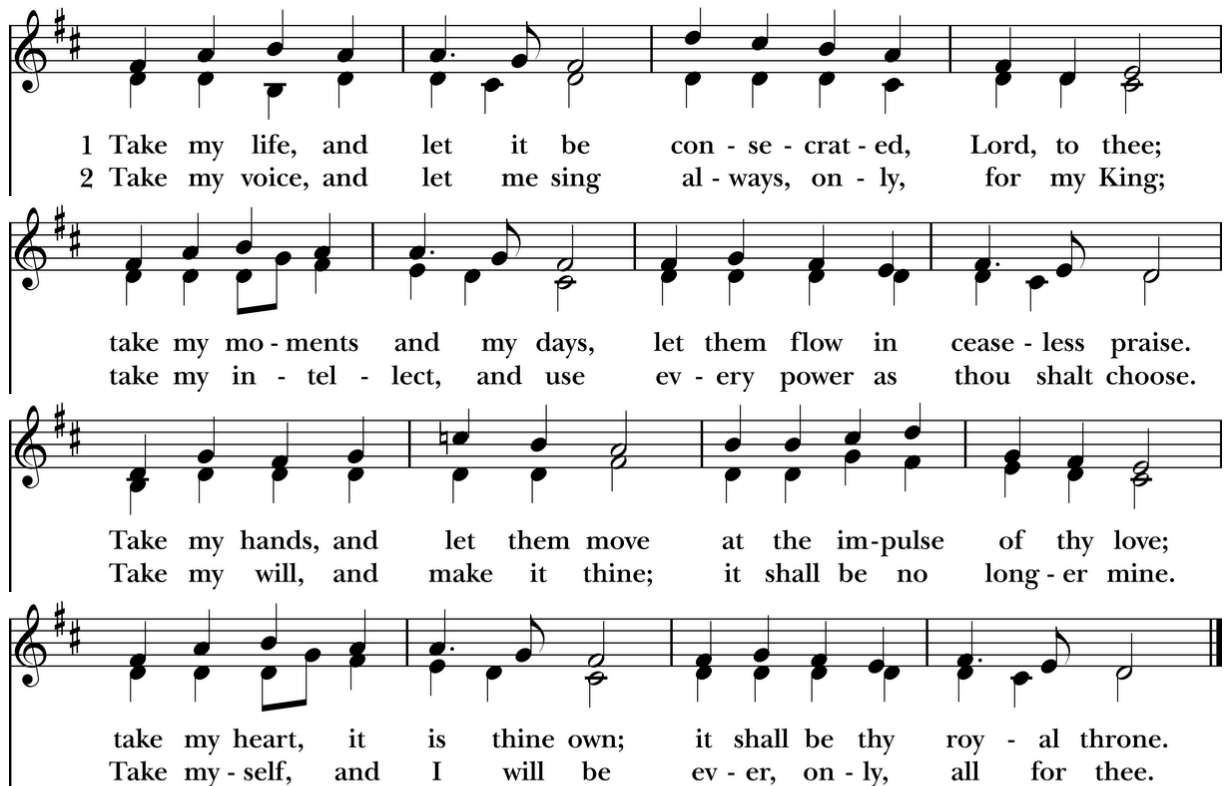

Sunday school for children and adults returns on September 6.

We can't wait to see our formation spaces full again!

SUNDAYS:

Nursery: St. Martin's provides a truly wonderful place for young children to begin a life-long faith journey. The nursery invites all children from birth to 3 years of age to come join the fun each Sunday, during 9:30 am Christian Formation hour, the 10:30 am worship service, Christmas Eve, and other special services. The nursery room is located in the parish hall building.

Godly Play (Pre-K - 3rd Grade): meets in the Godly Play room at 9:30 am. The curriculum includes biblical sacred stories and parables, saint stories, and holy communion lessons. Children conclude the lesson with wondering questions, drawing or clay molding craft, and Feast (snack time).

Art Group: Kids will explore their faith through painting, drawing, and service projects. The Art Club will meet on Sundays at 9:30 am in the youth room (located in the back corner of the parish hall.) This group is primarily for 4th-5th graders, but is open to all kids not otherwise engaged in another class!

Lectionary Study (Begins September 13): Each week during the Christian Formation time period at 9:30, we meet for lectionary study in the large conference room. This is a small group that reads the lectionary for the upcoming Sunday. Our goal is to prepare for the service and to help us better understand the priest's sermon. We gain insights from our readings and discussions and work on applying them to follow God's guidance in our lives.

Adult Formation & Confirmation Prep: Have you ever struggled with prayer? Got questions about Jesus? Want to learn about the Episcopal Church? This fall, St. Martin's will take a tour of the Book of Common Prayer (BCP). We'll learn about the history, beliefs, and worship of our church. You'll get to know how the BCP can support your spiritual life. Whether you're a lifelong Episcopalian, new to church, or anywhere in between, you're invited! This class also serves as confirmation prep for those looking to be confirmed this year. We meet in the main hall at 9:30 am.

WEEKDAY OPPORTUNITIES:

Wednesday Bible Study: Join St. Martin's clergy for Bible study each Wednesday at 10:30 am in the conference room and online. In September we'll start working through the Book of Exodus together. Our study is rooted in the Episcopal way of reading the Bible, holding together Scripture, tradition, and reason. Each week includes teaching, conversation, and space for your questions. All are welcome, whether you're opening the Bible for the first time or have studied it for years. Thursday Book Group: The Thursday Night Book Group is a welcoming space for conversation, curiosity, and connection. We'll gather weekly on Zoom.
